



Traffic results: Aviation comeback in 2022 Upswing to continue in 2023



Strong growth in 2022 following two tough crisis years

→ 23.7 million passengers at Vienna Airport, more than double prior-year passenger traffic, 30.1 million passengers in the Flughafen Wien Group (incl. Malta and Kosice airports), close to tripling of passenger volume

Growth trend expected to continue in 2023 - Passenger traffic will further increase

- Vienna Airport: 26-27 million passengers
- > Flughafen Wien Group: 32-34 million travellers
- Financial guidance: Net profit for the year of over € 150 million
- Airlines and flight connections are returning, long-haul traffic is expanding, initial announcements for the 2023 summer flight schedule are already promising

Strategy focusing on quality has a positive impact

→ Vienna Airport is the third most punctual airport with more than 20 million passengers in Europe (ahead of MUC, ZRH, FRA), "Best Airport in Europe" in 2022 for ACI. Vienna Airport is continuing its quality-oriented strategy: planned "Terminal 3 Southern Enlargement" project will be resumed.











Vienna Airport granted top quality awards for 2022

→ Payload Asia Award: Silver Medal in the category "Best Cargo Airport Europe"









Outlook for 2023: Further recovery of passenger traffic



- → Growth drivers in 2023 vs. 2022:
 - → Normalisation of passenger traffic in the first half of 2023 compared to 2022, with slight growth in the second half-year.
 - → Growth also in the Middle East (Saudi Arabia, Israel and UAE) and Far East (Taiwan, Japan, India and China).
 - → Announcements of airlines at Vienna Airport show a consistently positive trend.
- → In midsummer we expect about 90% of the passenger volume of 2019.

Improved quality and comfort: Terminal 3 Southern Enlargement project will be resumed, putting VIE in the premier league of airport terminals



Passengers can expect an improved quality of stay featuring enhanced comfort and service and significant expansion of their shopping and eating experience

Southern Enlargement: Terminal 3 to be expanded by 70,000 m²

- → New central security checkpoint
- → Expansion of shopping and restaurant space by approx. 10,000 m² (30 new outlets with a strong focus on domestic brands)
- → New, spacious lounge areas
- → Additional gate areas
- → Greater comfort thanks to more leisure places modern ambience
- → Convenient connection between Terminals 3 and 2 (behind security checkpoints)
- → Preparations underway Construction likely to begin in mid-2023 Opening planned for 2027

BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT AND FINANCIAL GUIDANCE FOR 2023





2023: Vienna Airport on a success path again Net profit for the year to increase to € 150 million, investments will double to € 135 million

- → The company is debt-free for the first time in decades, increasing investments to approx. € 135 million.
- → Positive outlook for 2023: 2023 revenue of approx. € 830 million, EBITDA of at least € 325 million, net profit for the year of at least € 150 million expected
- Dividends to be distributed after three years without any dividend payments, equalling at least 60% of the consolidated net profit (after non-controlling interests)



Dynamic development leads to increase in the number of employees



- Numerous business location projects at the airport from different sectors – from logistics to space technology
- → In 2023, the number of employees at the airport will rise by at least 800 people – The staff increase in the Flughafen Wien Group will equal about 250 employees



CO₂-neutral operations at Vienna Airport

Doubling of photovoltaic capacities to 45 hectares and approx. 100,000 panels will supply 40% of the airport's entire electricity needs in the future

- → Vienna Airport will reduce CO₂ emissions by about 60,000 tonnes annually compared to 2011 thanks to eight photovoltaic plants, emobility, CO₂-neutral geothermal energy and district heat and many other measures.
- → Austria's largest photovoltaic plant located at the airport has been in operation since May 2022 – Vienna Airport is continuing its climate protection drive, expanding photovoltaic capacities from 26 to 45 hectares in 2023.
- → About 40% of annual electricity consumption will be generated by solar power in the future.





The AirportCity is growing dynamically but sustainably: New hotel with 510 rooms about to be built



Go-ahead for Austria's fifth largest hotel located at Vienna Airport - Overnight accommodations to be expanded to 1,400 rooms

- → New hotel with 510 rooms is arising at Vienna Airport: The "Vienna House Easy" is Austria's fifth largest hotel Construction to begin in the autumn of 2023, opening planned for the spring of 2025
- → The airport site is thus expanding its overnight accommodations to 1,400 rooms
- → Focus on sustainability: woodbased hybrid construction, photovoltaics and wind power on the roof


