



Singapore's Low-Cost Carrier Scoot is Heading to Vienna: Three direct flights weekly to the City State in Southeast Asia as of June 2025

Vienna Airport announces a new airline and a new direct flight connection. Starting in June 2025, Scoot will take off from Vienna for the first time and fly directly to Singapore three times per week. A Boeing B787-8 (Dreamliner) aircraft will be deployed on the route. Accordingly, Vienna Airport will be directly linked to Singapore Changi International Airport and is thus expanding its offering of destinations to Southeast Asia.

“Scoot will bring Vienna closer to Southeast Asia. The new direct flight service enables passengers to reach Singapore without having to change to a connecting flight and travel further to numerous destinations via the airline’s flight network. This long sought-after long-haul connection strengthens our position as a flight hub and creates new perspectives for enhancing economic and tourism links between Austria and Southeast Asia. We are pleased to launch our close cooperation with Scoot starting in the summer of 2025”, states Julian Jäger, Joint CEO and COO of Vienna Airport.

“We are thrilled to announce the launch of our services to Vienna Airport, marking a significant milestone in Scoot's expansion. This new route not only strengthens our commitment to connecting travelers but also creates a direct link between Vienna and Singapore, bringing the vibrant culture and experiences of Southeast Asia closer to Eastern Europe. We look forward to welcoming passengers on board as they embark on new adventures and explore the rich heritage of both regions”, states Calvin Chan, Chief Commercial Officer of Scoot.

“The new ‘Scoot’ flight connects Singapore, one of the economically strongest regions in Asia, directly to Vienna, strengthening our airport as a hub and at the same time assuming an important feeder function for the Southeast Asian region and the Australian continent. Vienna and Singapore are two leading congress metropolises, and Vienna's attractiveness as a meeting destination will benefit from the direct connection”, explains Norbert Kettner, CEO of the Vienna Tourist Board.

Three weekly flights from Vienna Airport to Singapore

As of 3 June 2025, Scoot will operate three weekly flights (Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays) between Vienna and Singapore. The inaugural flight, TR708, will depart from Singapore Changi Airport at 03:00 a.m. and arrive in Vienna at 10:10 a.m. The return flight from Vienna, TR709, will leave at 11:25 a.m. and arrive at Singapore Changi International Airport at 04:50 a.m. A modern Boeing B787-8 (Dreamliner) aircraft will be deployed on the route.

Singapore: Diverse metropolis home to millions

Singapore is a fascinating travel destination combining modern urbanity with a rich cultural tradition and green nature. The city state offers world-famous sights such as the futuristic “Gardens by the Bay,” the iconic Marina Bay Sands and the historic Chinatown district.
