Traffic Results 2024 & Outlook for 2025



2024: New record year with 31.72 million passengers

Passenger volume up 7.4% vs. 2023 and 0.2% vs. 2019

Vienna Airport surpasses the pre-Covid level – more passengers than ever before

- New record figures for passengers, seat load factor and cargo
 - → Passengers: 31,719,836 travellers (+57,647 passengers more than in 2019, +7.4% vs. 2023)
 - → Seat load factor: 80.8% (+3.5%p vs. 2019 and +0.3%p vs. 2023)
 - → Cargo: 297,945 tonnes (+5.0% vs. 2019 and +21.6% vs. 2023)
- High quality services despite growth Vienna Airport continues to be the most punctual flight hub in the Lufthansa Group
- Records also in participations: 9 million (+14.8%) PAX at Malta Airport and 0.7 million (+18.2%) PAX at Košice Airport

Outlook 2025: Slightly positive development expected

Slight growth expected with approx. 32 million PAX at Vienna Airport and approx. 42 million for the Group,
 further growth potential in the medium term (esp. Asia)

Expectations of the new federal government: politicians must set the right framework conditions for growth

Aviation remains a growth industry: Abolition/dedication of the ticket tax, strengthening of regional airports,
 research and production funding for technology and SAF necessary

- Very strong passenger development at all Flughafen Wien Group airports Record number of passengers in Vienna, Malta and Košice
- Passenger growth of 9.1% yoy in the Flughafen Wien Group
- Increase in the number of destinations and frequencies
- Ongoing very high seat load factor



2024: 72 airlines serve 195 destinations in 65 countries

86% of travellers fly within Europe - good development in long-haul markets

- The largest share of traffic from Vienna is accounted for by Europe (85.9%)¹
 - Western Europe 69.3% (+8.5%) and Eastern Europe 16.6% (+8.4%)
- Far East: 3.5% market share strong growth (+18.7%) due to Beijing, Shanghai, Shenzhen, Tokyo
- North America: 3% market share significant growth (+10.5%) to destinations in the USA and Canada
- Middle East: 5.3% market share but -13.2% decline, esp. to Tel Aviv, Amman and Jeddah

Best cargo results in Vienna Airport's history Good geographical location and high-quality service are the decisive factors

- Significant increase in cargo volume of 21.6% to 297,945 tonnes vs. the previous
 year (+5.0% vs. 2019) belly freight with +43.8% vs.2023
- Strong growth of imports and exports transit hub for e-commerce
- A total of 38 cargo flights per week over 80% market share for VIE Handling
- Record result for pharmaceutical freight: +15.3% vs. 2023, more than double that
 of 2019 own pharmaceutical distribution centre with uninterrupted cold chain
 guarantees high quality
- Lufthansa Cargo extends handling contract for another four years
- Strengthened positioning as cargo hub to Asia: Co-operations with Incheon
 Airport and Korean Air
- Successful ISO recertification of cargo handling confirms highest quality
 standards new: IATA CEIV lithium battery certification







VIE: Most punctual flight hub in the Lufthansa Group 4th most punctual hub in Europe and 13th best airport worldwide

- Security checks: short waiting times for passengers and a high level of expertise
 - → Flughafen Wien provides security services in accordance with the strictest regulatory requirements
 - → Average waiting time: 95% of travellers wait less than 5 minutes at the security checkpoint
 - → Close coordination between all authorities and companies ensures a high level of security at the site
- VIE is the most punctual hub in the Lufthansa network, ahead of Munich, Zurich and Frankfurt
 - → 4th most punctual hub in Europe (ACI Jan-Nov 2024) and 13th among the world's best airports (Skytrax)
- Winter service: VIE team of 500 people keeps 2.6 million m² of apron area and aircraft free of snow and ice
 - → 1,500 lorry loads of snow on heavy winter days, team on call around the clock









Airlines are targeting Vienna: Comebacks & launches Steady increase in the destinations offered at the airport

- ANA resumes flights from Vienna to Tokyo
- Hainan Airlines recommences flights to Shenzhen and launches flight service to Chengdu
- Air Arabia once again links Vienna with Sharjah since December
- Sky Express now operates flights to and from Vienna
- Emirates offers Boeing 777 Premium Economy linking Dubai and Vienna
- Fleet modernisation and expansion at Austrian Airlines two out of a total of eleven new state-of-the-art Boeing 787 Dreamliners are now in use

Outlook for 2025:

- Scoot will launch flights connecting Vienna with Singapore
- Condor will open a base in Vienna and operate flights to Frankfurt



















Strong growth of participations

Malta and Košice record dynamic passenger growth







Malta Airport

- Record passenger numbers with 9.0 million PAX, +14.8% yoy
- Top markets: Italy, UK, Germany and Poland
- Investment programme to adapt facilities to current passenger volumes and business needs: increased capital expenditure on apron, VIP and passenger terminal extension, SkyParks 2 and photovoltaic system

Airport Košice

- Significant passenger record in 2024 with 735,384 PAX, +18.2% vs. 2023
- Very strong growth in summer charter traffic in particular (+23% vs. 2023)
- Celebrations to mark 100 years of Košice Airport first flight on 5 May 1924

- Slight growth expected at Vienna Airport and in the Flughafen Wien Group
- Uncertain economic forecast for 2025; ongoing supply bottlenecks for aircraft negatively impact global capacity growth
- The development of the conflicts in Ukraine and Israel is of particular importance to the traffic figures of Vienna Airport
- Growth in the 2024/25 winter flight schedule



Appeal to future policy makers Secure growth potential!

- The Austrian aviation sector generates € 8.2 billion annually and thus accounts for 1.75% of GDP
- Over 83,000 people are directly and indirectly dependent on the industry
- Aviation remains an indispensable growth industry in the medium to long term and therefore also an important factor for the development of the Austrian economy and tourism
- Therefore, a change of course in Austrian aviation policy towards growth-orientation instead of prevention and restriction is necessary - with the following priorities:
 - Abolition of the ticket tax or at least earmarking for SAF research and production creates allocational advantage in international competition and generates growth incentives for large-scale SAF production
 - Maintaining and expanding the competitive development and production location for aviation technologies by expanding and facilitating access to R&D funding
 - Clear commitment to regional airports and support for growth instead of restrictions





Business development and financial guidance for 2025



2024: Pleasing performance in all areas

Positive outlook for sales and earnings in 2025

Robust development expected despite economically challenging conditions

- Economic outlook: According to surveys, travelling is a high priority despite the weak economic situation
- Financial guidance 2025: sales of around € 1,080 million, EBITDA of around € 440 million, net profit for the period b.m. of around € 230 million
- Continuation of the investment offensive: investments increase to around € 300 million, financing from own funds - no borrowing needed
- Future increase in passenger numbers requires timely expansion of infrastructure

Urgent need for change in regulations that burden the positive development of air traffic

- Obligation to incorporate Sustainable Aviation Fuels (SAFs) is too expensive, SAF hardly available, rising CO₂ price
- Unbalanced burden sharing on the part of European airports and airlines leads to locational disadvantages and related negative economic effects
- New impetus urgently needed through government programme ensuring better connectivity

Financial highlights Q1-3/2024

Strong traffic increase and positive financial result as the main drivers

Clear improvement of revenue and earnings indicators

- Revenue +13.3% to € 792.5 million, EBITDA +10.8% to € 368.1 million, Group net profit b.m. +19.4% to € 207.0 million
- Revenue growth due to the dynamic increase in passengers, higher number of flight movements and fee adjustments pursuant to the charge regulation
- Rising interest income related to the higher investment volume and repayment of the
 EIB loan at the end of 2023 result in a clearly positive financial result (€ 11.9 million)

Increasing cost burden

- Salary increases mandated by the collective bargaining agreement (+7.0% as of 1 May 2024) and rise in the average number of employees
- Higher maintenance costs e.g., for runways and technology and at Malta Airport

→ Flughafen Wien AG will report on its preliminary results for the full year 2024 on 3 March 2025



Vienna Airport continues its investment drive in 2025

Capex will increase to about € 300 million

Southern Terminal Expansion is the biggest single investment project

- Construction on time and budget: building shell completed by the summer, topping out by the end of 2025
- Southern Terminal Expansion scheduled to be put into operation in 2027
- Total investment volume of approx. € 420 million (about € 120 million in 2025)
- Construction in accordance with state-of-the-art technical standards and supported by digitalisation (BIM)







The AirportCity continues to grow

TUI relocates corporate headquarter to airport - Office Park 4 extension







- Interest in office and commercial space in the AirportCity remains high new office
 capacity in planning
- **TUI** is opening its Austrian headquarters in the AirportCity
- The Health Center is the new location of the Austrian Aeromedical Center
- A new hotel, the "Vienna House Easy" with 510 rooms, will open at the end of 2025
 - → the biggest hotel at the airport and the fourth largest in Austria
- The strongest real estate brand in Austria for the fifth time
 - → the AirportCity was given the European Real Estate Brand Award
- Development of a new business location project



VIE Innovation Hub and space cluster are expanding

In-house innovation management, Plug & Play, high-tech location projects





- Successful partnership with the startup accelerator Plug & Play:
 - → 700 startups were screened by Plug & Play Austria over the last five years
 - → there are already 15 corporate partners
- Space cluster
 - → high-tech company **Enpulsion** with production in the AirportCity,
 - → ESA Phi-Lab at the site since 2024
 - → Establishment of 3 further space technology companies already finalized
- Digitalization and AI enable better service and higher productivity
 - → self-driving 'autonomous' wheelchairs
 - → Cleaning robots
 - → Full digitalization of planning, construction and operation BIM



Obligation to blend SAFs into conventional jet fuel Effective since 1 January 2025

- EU regulation since the beginning of 2025 requires to increasingly incorporate Sustainable Aviation Fuels (SAFs)
 into jet fuel
- The stipulated volumes for Austria:
 - → As of 2025: 20,000 tonnes p.a.
 - → As of 2030: 50,000 tonnes p.a.
 - → As of 2035: 200,000 tonnes p.a.
- Currently too expensive and production too low
- Location initiative to promote production facilities in Austria (biogenic feedstocks)
- Earmarking the revenue from the flight tax for CO₂ reduction by promoting the use of (SAFs)
